BCARES Update

Dick Burns, K8SKX, EC, Buncombe County ARES

The audio interference at the EOC has been identified and mostly fixed. W4MOE participated in the NC QSO Party February 28th from the Buncombe Emergency Management building. Their station was an IC-706 using one or the other HF antennas mounted at EOC: a B&W all band dipole or an AlphaDelta 80/40 trap dipole.

After a short time of operating, one of the radio dispatchers in EOC came over to say they could "hear us" over their radios. The interference apparently was "readable" but low enough not to cause much issue. We determined that the interference was worst using the trap dipole, 100 watts output on both 80m and 40m and occurred at most the EOC radio positions. Reducing the power and switching to the BW dipole almost eliminated the issue.

BCARES requested that the end of the trap dipole be moved from the EOC building to a point further away, this was done by Greg K4TMD and Nathan KG4LGY. On March 23 K8SKX, KI4VLW, KJ4CRL and KG4LGY met at EOC to test the new antenna location. Moving the end of the antenna eliminated the interference on 80m (100w) completely and reduced the 40m to a low level. We further determined that the interference was created in the wireless headsets used by the dispatchers, it did not occur when they used hard-wired headsets.

Field Day operations will be at the Fireman's Training Center (same location as in past years), near Erwin High School. NC Section News

Lots of exciting news this month, but first an action item. The threat of Amateur Radio losing a large portion of the 70 cm (420-450 MHz) band is real. Federal bill HR607, the "Broadband for First Responders Act of 2011 Act", in its present form would remove Ham Radio access to these frequencies. Many groups are opposing this provision, including the military, which shares this spectrum with us. An excellent story about the potential loss of this frequency appeared in USA Today at <www.usatoday.com/money/media/2011-03-29-hamradio29_ST_N.htm>. So far, less than 5% of North Carolina ARRL members, and only 1% of all NC Hams, have contacted their Congressional House members to ask them to oppose this bill in its present form. We've made it really easy as a two step process to send a letter to your Congressman.

Step 1: Go to <<http://www.kd4pyr.net/hamletter.htm>> and fill in your call sign. The letter will automatically put in the address of your Congressional representative along with suggested text. Print it out and sign it.

Step 2: Send your letter to ARRL's Washington, DC agent, Chwat & Co., which will hand deliver it to your Congressman's office. You have three ways to send it to Chwat:

WINS 2010 ROANOKE DIVISION SERVICE AWARD

Congratulations to Duke Knief, W4DK, winner of the 2010 Roanoke Division Service Award. Duke becomes the first North Carolinian to win this award since former Section Manager John Covington, W4CC, in 2005.

Duke is the 44th recipient of the annual award which is given to an exemplary operator in the four states which comprise the Roanoke Division – North Carolina, South Carolina, Virginia and West Virginia. Also known as the "Vic Clark Service Award", it is named after Vic Clark, W4KFC (SK), former Roanoke Division Director and ARRL President.

Duke was recognized for his many years of active service in ARES and as a chief proponent for the certification of ARES volunteers in the post 9/11 world. He's ARES District Emergency Coordinator (DEC) for Area 15, an active DXer, contester and has served as president of QCWA Chapter 76, the Blue Ridge Chapter. Duke received his award at the Charlotte Hamfest earlier in March. Congratulations, Duke.

YOUTH – Several neat events to report. First, the Old North State Council of Boy Scouts is hosting a huge camporee at Denton Farm Park in Denton April 29 – May 1. Several Hams have succeeded in getting permission to use the national BSA callsign K2BSA that weekend.
