### Vanity Call Sign Fees

On August 11, the FCC announced that the cost of an Amateur Radio vanity call sign will increase 60 cents, from \$11.70 to \$12.30. The fee will increase 30 days after notice of the increase is published in the Federal Register; no date has yet been set for publication. The Communications Act of 1934, as amended, authorizes the FCC to collect vanity call sign fees to recover the costs associated with that program. The vanity call sign regulatory fee is payable not only when applying for a new vanity call sign, but also upon renewing a vanity call sign for a new 10 year term. The vanity call sign fee has fluctuated over the 12 years of the current program -- from a

Most clubs and ARES groups are already doing activities that fit into their structure, so why not get credit for your actions?

## **National Preparedness Month and**

**Area 14...** I ask you this, are we prepared for an emergency? I can answer that in one word, NO! Can we become prepared for an emergency? Yes we can. First we need to make a plan, listing the things we need to do in the event of an emergency. The plan should include evacuation, where to go, where the shelters are located, a location where we can meet up with other family members, a list of telephone numbers that should be updated and reviewed frequently. Choose an emergency contact person outside the area. These are just a few of the things that should be included in your emergency plan. Think about what types of emergencies you are likely to encounter in your area, such as flash floods, high winds, severe thunderstorms or hazmat spills (remember we are on two Interstate Highways and also a major rail line; they all handle hazardous materials.) In any emergency situation, keep informed. Have enough food, water and medical supplies for 72 hours (three days). There is much more I could add.

Now, there is something we Americans are all guilty of, "Creeping Complacency." Remember 1999 when there was great concern that when all computers clicked over to 2000 (Y2K), and they would all fail, and the world would plunge into crisis? There was an outpouring of preparedness as we planned for this. Well nothing happened. All that preparedness was neglected. Shortly after 9/11 we went into preparedness mode as we readied our gear for the terrorist threat. Years later our preparedness efforts were neglected. After Katrina many of us readied our gear, sharpened our skills and prepared to respond when the next "big one" happened. Today, our gear is scattered and we are not near as ready to respond as we were just after Katrina.

I encourage each of you take a little time to get into the response/preparedness mode so if the "Big One" hits you will be ready.

A prominent local amateur radio operator, Harry, K4HU, 100, passed away Saturday, Aug. 9, 2008, at the Cardinal Care Center in Hendersonville after a period of declining health.

Born Sept. 19, 1907, to the late Louise Judd Mills and Harry Townsend Mills of Beaver, Pa., he had been a resident of Hendersonville since his retirement in 1972, after a 30-year worldwide career with RCA as an engineer and manager.

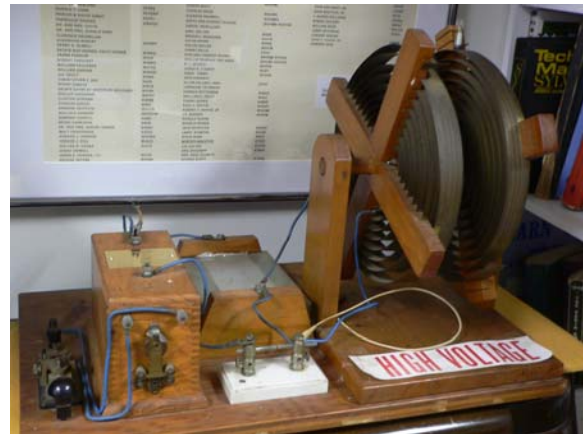
He was an 80-year member of the American Radio Relay League, a founder and past president of the Quarter Century Wireless Association, Chapter 76 of Hendersonville, and a fellow of the Radio Club of America. He was a brother of Lambda Chi Alpha fraternity.

He was preceded in death by his wife, Margaret Gerig Mills, in 1991; a sister, Margaret Mills Beatty; and two brothers, Frank and James. A son, Richard Mills of Hendersonville; two daughters, Dinah Mills of Wenatchee, Wand Bernice Mills of Livermore, Calif.; and numerous grandchildren and great-grandchildren survive him.

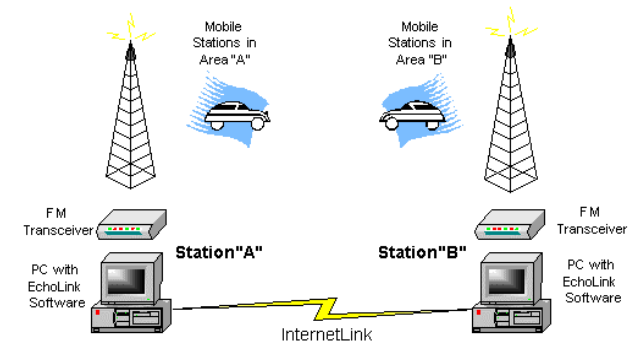
## Introduction to Some Digital Modes

### EchoLink

EchoLink® software allows licensed Amateur Radio stations to communicate with one another over the Internet, using voice-over-IP (VoIP) technology. The program allows worldwide connections to be made between stations, or from computer to station, greatly

enhancing Amateur Radio's communications capabilities. There are more than 200,000 validated users worldwide with about 4,000 online at any given time.

### Internet Radio Linking Project (IRLP)

IRLP is the brainchild of Dave Cameron, VE7LTD of Vancouver BC. IRLP is the abbreviation used for the Internet Radio Linking Project, which Dave developed over the past several years. Back in 1998 Dave became frustrated with the unreliable operation of the Windows based Voice over IP software. All Windows based amateur linking software used VOX and were not secure from non-amateur access. The IRLP network uses a digital switching concept and produces an instant and secure link between licensed repeaters around the world. Dave's custom IRLP software takes the audio from the receiver, feeds it into the sound card, and converts that into ADPCM digital data. The Linux PC then converts this digital information into digital packets each assigned with IP addresses for the destination node. These packets now flow through the internet to the destination Linux PC where the packets are decoded then sent to the sound card and out to the transmitter microphone of the link radio which then transmits the audio out over the local repeater. The transmitter is keyed as soon as these TCP/IP (Internet Protocol)



packets start to arrive. As soon as the data stops the link radio automatically un-keys and process reverses.

To assure security of the system, PGP keys are assigned to each node. When a connect request is made the connecting node exchange key challenges which must be correct or the connection is refused..

IRLP uses a 100% authentication system to assure the connecting nodes are authenticated and authorized to transmit on the amateur bands.

The called node has to prove to the calling node that he is who he claims to be. So the authentication is bi-directional. This ensures that one machine can't masquerade as another. The PGP key is created ONLY by the IRLP Installer and uploaded to the master IRLP server. This method of authentication assures licensing agencies that all audio being repeated on a node in another country has originated from a radio and not a PC.

Even though the IRLP uses the internet it does maximize the RF content. The philosophy behind IRLP is to have a radio as an entry and exit point in the system.

### Communication Plan on a Personal Level

Families may not be together when disaster strikes. It is important to plan in advance: how you will contact one another; how you will get back together; and what you will do in different situations.

#### Family Emergency Plan

It may be easier to make a long-distance phone call than to call across town, so an out-of-town contact may be in a better position to

communicate among separated family members.

Be sure every member of your family knows the phone number and has coins or a prepaid phone card to call the emergency contact. You may have trouble getting through, or the telephone system may be down altogether, but be patient.

#### Emergency Information

Find out what kinds of disasters, both natural and man-made, are most likely to occur in your area and how you will be notified. Methods of getting your attention vary from community to community. One common method is to broadcast via emergency radio and TV broadcasts. You might hear a special siren, or get a telephone call, or emergency workers may go door-to-door.

#### Emergency Plans

You may also want to inquire about emergency plans at places where your family spends time: work, daycare and school. If no plans exist, consider volunteering to help create one. Talk to your neighbors about how you can work together in the event of an emergency. You will be better prepared to safely reunite your family and loved ones during an emergency if you think ahead and communicate with others in advance.
